Did You Know...

- The organizational meeting of members of the school association was held on April 7, 1954. Eighteen people attended.
- The first Board meeting on record occurred 14 months later, on June 28, 1955.
- May of 1957: 5-acre property on McLaughlin Road South was purchased from Mr. Harper Bull for \$9,300.
- On August 31, 1959, a membership meeting was held in the school for the first time. Mr.
 Evert DeRuiter reported that everyone was in a festive mood. The meeting began with a reading of Psalm 111: "Praise the Lord! I will extol the Lord with all my heart."
- 28 new families joined us in September 2020.
- Our current school community represents more than 59 different church communities.
- Besides our currently enrolled students, more than 2700 students have passed through the school doors since the school was founded in 1959.
- Since 1959, JKCS has graduated 1622 eight grade students.
- Our largest graduating class was in 2006 with 50 students.
