eedless to say, 2020 was not the kind of year we ever imagined! However, as much as we faced challenges in 2020, I can still look back and find so much to be thankful for and much to be hopeful about as we look ahead to 2021.

We started the school year in the spirit of celebration with festivities in honour of John Knox's 60th Anniversary and the amazing blessing of Encore Thrift Store reaching a MILLION DOLLARS in donations since opening its doors in April 2015. With this momentum, we entered 2020, ready to springboard to new initiatives and increased passion for the next 60 years of Christ-centered learning.

January began as usual with excitement for the extra-curricular activities John Knox offers its students along with student-led conferences, planning for our Celebration of Learning and our Project-based Learning units. In March, everything changed. With the news of the pandemic looming closer, we had to shift to a new way of doing things, reinventing our learning, our environments, and our interactions.

Although it was difficult, through it all, we couldn't help but recognize the incredible opportunity we had as a Christian school to speak the message of God's HOPE. With the support of a wonderful community, our intent grew stronger each day as we found ways to stay connected, to remain healthy and share this HOPE with our families, our city, and the world. We created our *Project of Hope*, sent words of blessing designed by students to the elderly and those in long term care homes and our friends at Encore, and

Read on to learn a little more about their relationship with JKCS!



Tell us how you first got involved with JKCS and why?

We came to Brampton in 1977 so that our children could attend JKCS. We were expecting our 3rd child and were excited about raising our family in a community such as JKCS.

What's your first memory of JKCS?

My first membership meeting, shortly after that I became part of the board of JKCS. Mary recognized that there was a good community here and that people were really working together. There were a lot of volunteers and fundraising

efforts and events going on such as the Walkathon, delivering of Consumers Gas bills, Craft Sales and many others. It felt supportive and we knew we had made the right choice.

Are there other supporters, community members that have been inspiring for you?

Tom Riedstra, who was Chair of the Board at the time, was very passionate and enthusiastic about Christian Education; he lived it daily. It was always on his heart and mind.

Albert Buisman was the Treasurer for many years at

Gary, you started a Hockey Tournament fundraiser for JKCS in the early 90's. Tell us about that.

A committee was formed with several other enthusiastic parents. We ran the tournament for 12 years and then it continued on with other volunteers for many more years until 2017. I continued to attend and help out however I could. The JKCS Boxing Day Hockey Tournament was a big part of my life for many years.

I believe that there is more potential and opportunity for Christian Education. There is so much going on right now, people are feeling like the world is upside down. Society needs Jesus and that means there is a need for Christian Education.

How would (someone) describe you? Or how might you describe yourself?

(Gary) A type of person who has always been very involved in the community. I volunteered and took leadership roles; Mary also has always been involved and continues to be with JKCS. Proud grandparents. Passionate supporters of Christian Education. We seek to be followers of Christ.

What would you tell someone who is thinking about being part of and supporting JKCS?

Financial Update

The LORD has blessed JKCS Brampton with amazing financial results 2020 and the 2020-21 school year. The JKCS budget projected a deficit for 2019-20. When COVID-19 hit there was much concern that the deficit would grow. But God had some surprises in store; some special estate gifts, compensation from the Region of Peel for utility work on the school property, and federal employee wage subsidies all helped to turn the projected deficit into a sizable surplus!

The Challenges

COVID-19 has created many challenges for our finances in 2020-21, including rental revenue losses, hiring more staff to keep class sizes lower, higher janitorial, cleaning and busing expenses. Despite these challenges, this school year started on a positive note with a large estate gift, and once again, JKCS has qualified for the wage subsidy. As a result, we are now forecasting that our budgeted deficit of \$240,000 will be cut in half to \$120,000. With the prior year's surplus, this has created an opportunity for sustainability and growth for JKCS through the continued support and efforts of our JKCS community.


JKCS will be hosting a free virtual Estate Planning Clinic with Christian School Foundation and Christian Stewardship Services on March, 24, 2021 @7pm.

- The second annual Year-End Appeal raises over \$35K for JKCS, 3x the amount raised with the first Year-End Appeal in 2019. Yet another display of the incredibly supportive community that surrounds the school.



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
