
MS. WYMENGA WRITES,

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Financial Update and Challenges

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The LORD has continued to financially bless JKCS despite the ongoing challenges posed by COVID-19. 2021-22 started with 119 families enrolled, up from 113 in 2020-21. We budgeted for a large deficit, however, ended with a surplus of \$185,000 due to larger than expected federal wage subsidies, estate gifts, and Encore donations. God is good! He provides through our gracious and faithful community.

THE CHALLENGES

COVID-19 restrictions and public health measures continued to place pressure on the school's finances with higher than usual teaching staff levels, greater janitorial, cleaning, and busing expenses. The school's transportation costs are posing a particular challenge. Currently, the school recovers only 22% of the actual cost through busing fees charged to parents. A 'Transportation Task Force' was struck to study the issue of

this growing shortfall and recommend ways to improve cost recovery while maintaining current service levels. Transportation fees will be increased for the 2022-23 school year.

Increases in tuition revenues due to higher enrollment, greater recovery of transportation costs as well as the continued support and efforts of our JKCS community is expected to stabilize and strengthen the school's financial position in the coming year. Please join us in praying that the LORD will bless the school with strong enrollment and the continued support of our faithful donors.
